EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Africa Global Environmental Health Incorporated (AGEHI) is a legally registered non-governmental organization established to promote environmental sustainability, public health awareness, sanitation improvement, and community empowerment throughout Liberia. AGEHI seeks to implement a Two-year Community Environmental Sanitation and Public Health Awareness Initiative in Montserrado County to address poor sanitation practices, inadequate waste management, environmental pollution, and limited public awareness on environmental health issues.

The project will focus on improving community sanitation conditions through environmental awareness campaigns, community clean-up exercises, school sanitation education, waste management advocacy, hygiene promotion, and public health sensitization activities. The initiative will engage local authorities, community leaders, youth groups, women organizations, schools, and health stakeholders to encourage sustainable sanitation practices and healthy environmental behaviors.

The project aims to directly benefit approximately 25,000 residents across selected communities within Montserrado County while indirectly benefiting thousands more through public education and community engagement.

The estimated total budget for the project is USD 85,000.

ORGANIZATIONAL BACKGROUND

AGEHI was established to respond to increasing environmental and public health challenges affecting vulnerable communities, particularly in urban and peri-urban areas where poor sanitation and waste disposal continue to threaten public health and environmental safety.

The organization works collaboratively with local communities, government institutions, development partners, and civil society organizations to create environmentally safe and healthy communities.

To become a leading African and global environmental health organization that promotes safe, sustainable, and healthy environments for present and future generation.

PROJECT BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION

Montserrado County remains one of the most densely populated counties in Liberia and continues to face serious environmental sanitation and public health challenges. Improper waste disposal, clogged drainage systems, open dumping of garbage, poor hygiene practices, and limited public awareness contribute significantly to environmental pollution and the spread of communicable diseases.

Many communities experience frequent flooding during rainy seasons due to blocked drainage systems filled with waste materials. These environmental conditions increase the risk of malaria, cholera, typhoid, diarrhea, and other sanitation-related diseases.

Despite government and partner interventions, there remains a strong need for continuous community engagement, public awareness campaigns, and sanitation education to encourage behavioral change and improve environmental conditions.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

Communities within Montserrado County continue to face major environmental and public health problems caused by:

- Poor waste disposal practices.
- Limited public awareness on environmental health.
- Blocked drainage systems causing flooding.
- Increased spread of sanitation-related diseases.

PROJECT GOAL

To improve environmental sanitation and promote public health awareness in Montserrado County through community engagement, sanitation campaigns, environmental education, and sustainable hygiene practices within Two (2) year.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- To promote a clean, healthy, and environmentally safe community environment in Montserrado County.

Specific Objectives

- To conduct environmental sanitation awareness campaigns in targeted communities.

- To organize monthly community clean-up exercises.
- To educate and strengthen public awareness on disease prevention and sanitation-related health risks.
- To encourage proper waste disposal and environmental protection practices.
- To collaborate with local authorities and stakeholders on sanitation improvement initiatives.
- To empower community volunteers as sanitation ambassadors.

Estimated direct beneficiaries: 25,000 people.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES

Activity 1: Community Environmental Awareness Campaigns

AGEHI will conduct regular awareness campaigns to educate communities on:

- Proper waste disposal
- Personal hygiene
- Disease prevention
- Environmental protection
- Drainage maintenance

- Social mobilization

The project will adopt a participatory and community-based implementation approach.

- Youth and women participation

AGEHI will establish community sanitation committees to support implementation and ensure sustainability.
